### Day 01: 18<sup>TH</sup> MAY, DEPART FROM KOLKATA

#### Meals: Meal on board

### Day 02: 19<sup>TH</sup> MAY, ARRIVE AT SEATTLE – VANCOUVER

Arrive at Seattle and complete all immigration formalities before boarding the luxury coach. Proceed to Vancouver, a major coastal city situated on a peninsula in the southwest corner of mainland **British Columbia**, Canada, known for its stunning natural setting between the Pacific Ocean and the Coastal Mountains. It is bordered by the Strait of Georgia, English Bay and the Fraser River. With its scenic views, mild climate and friendly people, Vancouver is known around the world as both a popular tourist attraction and one of the best places to live - the perfect combination of urban meets nature.

Proceed for a half day guided city tour of Vancouver referred to as the “Gateway of the Pacific”. Enjoy picturesque views of the mountains while exploring the city’s natural beauty, cosmopolitan flavor and the diversity of experiences of Vancouver. Visit the **Stanley Park** - Vancouver's largest urban park, a 400-hectare natural West Coast rainforest with scenic trails, beaches and views along the Seawall, home to the **Totem Poles** at Brockton Point – a public space showcasing the art, history and culture of the region’s indigenous people and West Coast First Nations. Next, visit **English Bay**, a popular public beach and park offering beautiful waterfront views and Kitsilano Beach. Launched in 2000, it features music-theme decor, multiple dining options, a spa, and entertainment, and offers a blend of classic style and comfortable amenities. The ship's decor is inspired by music, with features like signed guitars from famous musicians and a pipe organ. It holds 1,432 passengers and 600 crew members. Guests can enjoy a spa, multiple dining options, bars, lounges, and recreational facilities. The 1500-passenger ship Zaandam (named after Holland's Zaandam City) boasts an atrium filled with signature sculpture. The Zaandam is primarily a West Coast ship and features an elegant decor with rich wood, boldly colored fabrics and unique lighting.

The Holland America MS Zaandam cruise ship starts sailing in the late afternoon. Stops along the route showcase Alaska's rich history, including Native Alaskan culture in Ketchikan and Skagway's Gold Rush era legacy. Enjoy beautiful views from the deck of the cruise along with enjoying an international buffet in the cruise.



**Day 05: 22<sup>ND</sup> MAY: TRACY ARM INLET – JUNEAU – CRUISE**

After breakfast in the cruise, proceed for **Tracy Arm Inlet** (access to shore, limited to shore excursion). Tracy Arm Inlet is a stunning fjord in Alaska, about 45-50 miles south-east of Juneau, known for its dramatic scenery, steep cliffs, and the twin Sawyer Glaciers at its end. Visitors can experience this area on cruises, which often navigate through icebergs to get close to the glaciers and observe wildlife like seals, whales, and bears, mountain goats roaming across various corners of this pristine area—not to mention chubby baby seals resting on the ice floes along with view of several waterfalls. The inlet is also part of the Tracy Arm-Fords Terror Wilderness, a protected area within the pure wilderness of Tongass National Forest. This awe-inspiring fjord extends over 30 miles, cutting through steep, towering cliffs and pristine glaciers fringed by the largest intact coastal temperate rainforests, making it a top choice for travellers seeking an authentic Alaskan adventure. The fjord is home to the twin Sawyer Glaciers, which are a major highlight, often calving large chunks of ice into the water.

We recommend to pack warm clothing along with waterproof gear, even when travelling by cruise. More than a meter and a half of rain falls here each year! We also recommend a water bottle, thermos or reusable coffee cup. On scenic cruising days, cruise ships ban paper and disposable plastic products that could litter this unsullied environment.

Next, proceed to Juneau, Alaska and visit the most remote, most beautiful and strangest state capital in the United States. Juneau is celebrated for its stunning natural wonders and rich history including the Mendenhall Glacier, whale watching etc. Surrounded by water, forest and mountain sights, visitors seeking things to do in Juneau can hike a glacier, eat fresh-caught fish on a seaside patio and tour a grand capitol building all in one day. Juneau is known for its outdoor recreation, fresh seafood and fine dining. You can hike up Mount Roberts to chance upon wild deer and bald eagles. Most sightseeing and whale-watching tours head north to Auke Bay—bring a good pair of binoculars to get the best view of these majestic and surprisingly graceful creatures. If you prefer land mammals, catch a floatplane to a nearby wildlife reserve such as Chichagof or Admiralty Island to spy some bears lolling around on Alaska cruise excursion.

The sleepy, misty city of around 32,000—mostly fishermen and small-business owners—has a frontier town vibe, but welcomes more than a million visitors each summer to its natural attractions, cementing Juneau as Alaska's number-one tourist destination. Experience this breathtaking city on an Alaska cruise.



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**Day 06: 23<sup>RD</sup> MAY, SKAGWAY – CRUISE**

Today, the cruise arrives at Skagway in the morning. At the height of the Klondike Gold Rush, the port town of Skagway served as the primary gateway to the legendary gold fields, and quickly grew into Alaska's largest settlement. It was then a raucous frontier hub packed with trading posts, saloons and guesthouses. As the gold rush faded into the 1900s, so did Skagway—but today it has been reinvigorated as a gateway for a new kind of visitor: those looking to explore Alaska's colourful history, pristine wildlife and unrivaled natural beauty. Set sail on an Alaska Cruise and take an adventure in Skagway. At every turn, you'll find yourself immersed in gold rush lore, from the infamous Red Onion Saloon that still keeps a pistol that Wyatt Earp left behind. En-route to the Klondike, to the White Pass & Yukon Route Railroad is a classic narrow-gauge railway that traverses rugged mountains and passes, cascading waterfalls and towering glaciers as it connects Skagway to Whitehorse deep in the Yukon. Ketchikan has long been an important hub of the salmon-fishing and packing industries. Visitors can try their luck on sport fishing or simply savour the fresh seafood at one of the local restaurants on a cruise to Ketchikan excursion. Ketchikan is also one of the best spots along the Inside Passage to explore the rich cultural sights of Native Alaskan nations like the Tlingit, Haida and Tsimshian. You can see intricately carved totem poles at the Totem Heritage Center and Totem Bight State Park, while the attractions of Saxman Village just outside of Ketchikan offers the chance to see Tlingit culture in action, with working carvers and a dance show in the clan house. On an Alaska cruise to Ketchikan, don't forget to explore the sights in the town itself, including historic Creek Street, a boardwalk built over the Ketchikan Creek, where you can shop for souvenirs, smoked salmon and local art, while exploring gold rush-era tourist attractions like Dolly's House Museum.

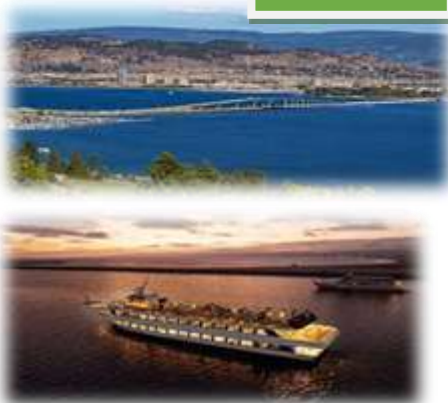

**Day 11: 28<sup>TH</sup> MAY: KELOWNA – LAKE LOUISE – BANFF**

After breakfast, travel through Vermont Stop at **Roger's Pass**. Proceed to Lake Louise – a hamlet at Banff National Park in the Canadian Rockies, known for its turquoise, glacier-fed lake ringed by high peaks and overlooked by a stately chateau. The turquoise colour of the water comes from rock flour carried into the lake by the water melting from the glaciers that overlook the lake.

It is Canada's "Diamond in the Wilderness" and "Hiking Capital of Canada". There is only one place in the world that can genuinely offer spectacular natural mountain scenery, abundant wildlife, four-season recreation and world class accommodation in a protected National Park setting. Enjoy the sightseeing at **Lake Louise**. Then proceed to Banff. Banff National Park that boasts some of the world's finest unspoiled ecosystems. Rocky mountain peaks, turquoise glacial lakes, a picture-perfect mountain town and village, abundant wildlife and scenic drives come together in Banff National Park - Canada's first national park and the flagship of the nation's park system. Banff encompasses 6,641 square kilometres of mountainous terrain, with numerous glaciers and ice fields. Each year, millions of visitors come to Banff to marvel at the emerald waters of Lake Louise, walk amongst the flower-filled heavens at Sunshine Meadows, and drive beneath the towering jagged peaks lining the **Icefields Parkway**. Snow-capped peaks, glistening glaciers and sweeping vistas



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are just a part of the allure of Banff National Park. Enjoy a thrilling ride to the top of the **Sulphur Mountain** on the **Banff Gondola**. Check-in to the hotel, have dinner and stay overnight.

## Day 12: 29<sup>TH</sup> MAY, BANFF – ICEFIELDS PARKWAY – JASPER – SUN PEAKS – VALEMOUNT By Road

### Meals: Breakfast & Dinner

Have breakfast and proceed to discover one of the favourite resort towns of the Canadian Rockies and its beautiful environment on a tour of Banff. Visit the intriguing hoodoos earth pillars shaped by centuries of wind, the spot where Banff's history began. Travel the scenic **Icefields Parkway**. The Icefields Parkway is a 230-km (144-mile) scenic highway in Alberta, Canada, connecting **Banff and Jasper National Parks** through the Canadian Rockies. It is renowned for its stunning views of glaciers, waterfalls, towering peaks, and turquoise lakes, making it one of the world's most scenic drives. Visitors can stop at numerous lookouts, hike trails, and see abundant wildlife. The scenery includes glaciers, icefields like the **Columbia Icefield, Athabasca Falls and Sunwapta Falls** and vibrant turquoise lakes. Abundant wildlife is often visible, including elk, bighorn sheep, and bears. If you wish, you can opt for the **Columbia Icefields Explorer** tour(optional cost applicable). Tour through Jasper National Park. Jasper is the largest national park in the Canadian Rockies known for its vast wilderness, majestic peaks, abundant wildlife and outstanding natural beauty. It is located in the province of Alberta, north of Banff National Park and west of Edmonton. The park includes the glaciers of the Columbia Icefield, hot springs, lakes, waterfalls and mountains.

Next, proceed for a scenic drive heading towards **Sun Peaks**. The hills looming north-east of Kamloops are home to Sun Peaks resort. This ever-growing resort boasts 135 ski runs (including some 8 km long powder trails, 12 lifts and a pleasant base area village). It is a family-friendly and affordable year-round resort surrounded by three mountains. Striking a delicate balance between natural setting and convenient amenities, Sun Peaks Resort offers incredible access to cross-country skiing, downhill skiing and snowboarding in winter and hiking, golfing and mountain biking in summer. Sun Peaks also caters to foodies with a great selection of restaurants and annual food and wine festivals.

Reach **Sun Peaks** in the afternoon and envisage amazing scenic surrounding. Sun Peaks European-style village is nestled at the centre of the resort's three mountains. The village features shopping boutiques, restaurants and accommodations, all within easy walking distance. The village is just minutes from the resort's chairlifts and an endless array of winter and summer activities.

Later, proceed to Valemount for an overnight stay after dinner. Valemount is the closest community west of Jasper National Park and the nearest community to



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Mount Robson, which is the tallest mountain in the Canadian Rockies and the origin of the Fraser River. Clear blue skies, snow-capped peaks, and refreshing lakes and rivers await you in Valemount.

**Day 13: 30<sup>TH</sup> MAY, VALEMOUNT – WELLS GRAY PARK – KAMLOOPS**
**By Road**
**Day 13**
**Meals: Breakfast & Dinner**

Today, enjoy breakfast in the hotel and if you wish, you can opt for a Bear Safari Tour(optional cost applicable).

Next, proceed towards **Wells Gray Park** with a stop at **Spahat's Falls and Dutch Lake**. Wells Gray Park is a spectacular destination hidden in the Cariboo Mountains of east-central British Columbia. Famed for its old-growth rainforest, lush alpine meadows, and many waterfalls, Wells Gray offers an extraordinary range of outdoor attractions. Spend some time in the lush alpine meadows with opportunities for excellent bird-watching and wildlife viewing.

Then, proceed to Kamloops to start your unforgettable journey of the Canadian Rockies. With jagged, ice-capped peaks, lakes, diverse wildlife and outdoor recreation sites, we head towards Kamloops - a city in south central British Columbia, at the confluence of the two branches of the Thompson River and near Kamloops Lake. It is a scenic drive with a lot of beautiful photo stops. Have dinner, check-in to the hotel and stay overnight at Kamloops.


**Day 14: 31<sup>ST</sup> MAY: KAMLOOPS – COQUIHALLA CANYON PARK – WHISTLER**
**By Road**
**Day 14**
**Meals: Breakfast & Dinner**

After breakfast, check-out from the hotel and proceed towards Coquihalla Canyon Park located **on the north shore of the Coquihalla River in southwestern British Columbia**. This provincial park includes the Othello Tunnels built as part of the Kettle Valley Railway in 1914. The railway, connecting the Kootenay Region with the BC coast, was built over three mountain ranges.

In the Coquihalla Gorge, the river cut a 300-foot-deep channel of solid granite. A straight line of tunnels was built through it which are now known as the Othello Tunnels. Enroute visit Othello Tunnels, also known as the Quinette Tunnels. It is a wonderful canyon with great history on the railway and tunnels.

Later, proceed to Whistler for an overnight stay after dinner.


**Day 15: 1<sup>ST</sup> JUNE: WHISTLER – VANCOUVER – SEATTLE**
**By Road**
**Day 15**
**Meals: Breakfast & Dinner**

After breakfast, check-out from the hotel and proceed for an orientation tour of **Whistler**. Explore the pedestrian village with parks and lakes. You can opt for '**Peak 2 Peak**' gondola ride or walk through the Cloudraker Skybridge, a suspension bridge for impressive alpine vistas at your own expense(optional cost applicable).
